GENERAL VOTING INFORMATION

ID for Voting in MO

- ✓ Current Missouri Driver's License or Non-Driver License
- ✓ Non-expired Passport or Military ID

Accessible Voting

- ✓ All Central Polling Locations are accessible (including GSB Arena)
- ✓ **Curbside voting:** for voters with limited mobility, a Democrat *and* Republican election official will come to your car with a ballot
- ✓ Accessible Voting Systems: Every polling place has an accessible voting system for those with disabilities

Are you registered to vote in a Missouri county but don't have MO state-issued ID, passport, or military ID?

You can still vote *in the county you're registered in*. At the polls, tell the election officials you are registered but don't have one of the abovementioned forms of ID. They will provide you with a "provisional ballot" and an envelope. You'll vote the ballot, put it in the envelope, and sign the outside. Your voter registration signature will later be matched to your ballot envelope signature by a bipartisan team for your vote to count.

Are you registered to vote in a different county in Missouri?

- ✓ You can change your MO county of registration to Greene County on ELECTION DAY at County Clerk's Office, 840 N. Boonville; vote there.
- ✓ Absentee Voter Information
 - <u>Absentee in-person voting</u> simplest option if you go to your home county began September 24 in all Missouri counties at the local election authority (see <u>US Vote Foundation</u>)
 - For Greene County: Election Center, 1126 N. Boonville Ave until Nov 4; from Oct 22 to Nov 4 also at Library Center, 4653 S. Campbell Ave Absentee vote by mail: Deadline to request absentee ballot has passed
- ✓ Free <u>notaries at MSU</u>
- ✓ PSU 2nd floor notary tabling:

Mon Oct 28: 1- 2 Wed Oct 30: 1-3 Fri Nov 1: 11-1

- 1. Go to sos.mo.gov.
- 2. Click on Elections and Voting pull-down menu.
- 3. Click on Check Your Voter Registration.
- 4. Fill in the requested five blanks and the captcha box and hit Submit.
- 5. On Current Voter Registration Information page, scroll to Election Resources.
- Click on the round View Candidates & Issues button to see your own ballot information; it is printable.

MISSOURI BALLOT MEASURES

Amendment 2 (If passed, this measure will have no impact on taxes.) Do you want to amend the Missouri Constitution to:

- allow the Missouri Gaming Commission to regulate licensed sports wagering including online sports betting, gambling boats, professional sports betting districts and mobile licenses to sports betting operators;
- restrict sports betting to individuals physically located in the state and over the age of 21;
- allow license fees prescribed by the Commission and a 10% wagering tax on revenues received to be appropriated for education after expenses incurred by the Commission and required funding of the Compulsive Gambling Prevention Fund; and
- allow for the general assembly to enact laws consistent with this amendment?

Amendment 3 (If passed, this measure may reduce local taxes while the impact to state taxes is unknown.)

Do you want to amend the Missouri Constitution to:

- establish a right to make decisions about reproductive health care, including abortion and contraceptives, with any governmental interference of that right presumed invalid;
- remove Missouri's ban on abortion;
- allow regulation of reproductive health care to improve or maintain the health of the patient;
- require the government not to discriminate, in government programs, funding, and other activities, against persons providing or obtaining reproductive health care; and
- allow abortion to be restricted or banned after Fetal Viability except to protect the life or health of the woman?

Amendment 5 (If passed, this measure will have no impact on taxes.) Do you want to amend the Missouri Constitution to:

- allow the Missouri Gaming Commission to issue one additional gambling boat license to operate on the portion of the Osage River from the Missouri River to the Bagnell Dam;
- require the prescribed location shall include artificial spaces that contain water and are within 500 feet of the 100-year base flood elevation as established by the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and
- require all state revenues derived from the issuance of the gambling boat license shall be appropriated to early-childhood literacy programs in public institutions of elementary education?

Amendment 6 (If passed, this measure will have no impact on taxes.)
Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to provide that the administration of justice shall include the levying of costs and fees to support salaries and benefits for certain current and former law enforcement personnel?
State and local governmental entities estimate an unknown fiscal impact.

Amendment 7 (If passed, this measure will have no impact on taxes.)

[NOTE: Only U.S. Citizens can vote under current law]

Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to:

- Make the Constitution consistent with state law by only allowing citizens of the United States to vote;
- Prohibit the ranking of candidates by limiting voters to a single vote per candidate or issue: and
- Require the plurality winner of a political party primary to be the single candidate at a general election?

Proposition A (If passed, this measure will have no impact on taxes.) Do you want to amend Missouri law to:

- increase minimum wage January 1, 2025 to \$13.75 per hour, increasing \$1.25 per hour each year until 2026, when the minimum wage would be \$15.00 per hour:
- adjust minimum wage based on changes in the Consumer Price Index each January beginning in 2027;
- require all employers to provide one hour of paid sick leave for every thirty hours worked;
- allow the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to provide oversight and enforcement; and
- exempt governmental entities, political subdivisions, school districts and education institutions?

Note: some cities (such as Springfield) may also have local ballot measures.

New voter FAQ

Where do I vote?

At the polling location listed on your Voter ID card OR vote at MSU Welcome Center if registered to vote here in Greene County.

I'm unsure about some ballot items – do I have to vote for everything? No. Vote only for what you're sure about; your ballot will still count!

Can I take my notes into the polling place?

Sure! This isn't a test. You can take your notes or a pre-marked sample ballot into the polling place.
